Monthly Report for the month of August, 2022

Name of the Ministry / Department: Department of Sports

1. Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

- a) The Indian contingent proudly finished its Birmingham Commonwealth Games campaign at 4th Place with a total of 61 medals including 22 Gold medals. Despite the absence of high medal potential disciplines like Shooting and Greco-Roman Wrestling, the Indian athletes gave the nation, one of its best CWG performances with special mention to the outstanding performances in the disciplines of Wrestling (12) and Weightlifting (10). The Indian Lawn Bowls Teams had a stellar run in the CWG, where the Women's Team & Men's Team won the Gold and the Silver Medal respectively.
- b) The National Sports Day was celebrated on 29th August, 2022 on a grand scale across the country. Various events were organized across the country by various organizations including Sports Promotions Boards, Khelo India Academies, State Level Khelo India Centres, SAI Centres, etc. More than 6900 notable events were organized with more than 10 lakh enthusiastic participants. The Officials of this Ministry also participated actively in a grand event organized at Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium. Sporting stars Yogeshwar Dutt, Akhil Kumar, Zafar Iqbal, CWG medalist Tejaswin Shankar and U-15 Judo cadet world champion Linthoi Chanambam graced the celebrations at JLN Stadium with their presence.
- c) Through "Meet the Champions" initiative of this Ministry, 25 elite athletes, including Indian Men's Hockey Team Captain Manpreet Singh, Boxer Nikhat Zareen, CWG Lawn Bowls gold medal winners, visited schools across the country to create awareness among students on the three important aspects - sports, fitness and balanced diet.
- d) Department of Sports has invited online applications from eligible Sportspersons, Coaches, Organisations and Universities for the National Sports Awards, 2022. This year, applications are being accepted only online through DBT-MIS Portal. Those applicants who are eligible as per the award guidelines are permitted to self-apply between 27.08.2022 & 20.09.2022.
- e) The other important activities during the period are as follows:
 - i. The 80th and 81st Meetings of Mission Olympics Cell (MOC) were held on 04.08.2022 and 25.08.2022 on various components of Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS), in which proposals from various athletes worth Rs. 1,48,97,071/- were approved.
 - ii. After the country-wide success of Fit India School Quiz, the Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports announced the 2nd edition of Fit India School Quiz, and the registration for the events is in progress since 03.09.2022.

- iii. The 16th Governing Body and the 14th General Body Meeting of the National Dope Testing Laboratory were held on 3rd August 2022 under the chairmanship of the Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports.
- iv. The first phase of Inaugural Khelo India Women's Hockey League (U-16) was successfully organized at Major Dhyanchand Stadium, New Delhi between 16th & 23rd of August, 2022.
- v. The First Khelo India Women's Judo Tournament was organized across four zones in India, starting August 27. The zonal-level competitions concluded on 31st August, 2022.
- vi. To encourage, promote and popularize the indigenous sports and games, media campaigns on 25 Indigenous Sports were run by FIT India Mission with campaigns on 5 of those Indigenous Sports organized on various social media platforms between 22.08.2022 and 26.08.2022.

5. Status of ongoing Swachhta Abhiyan (progress under Special Campaign):

Following activities were conducted for the special campaign of Swachhta Abhiyan:

- a) A campaign was organized in the office of the National Anti-Doping Agency, where the utility spaces were cleaned. Officials were encouraged to maintain clean & hygienic office premises. Workstations and office spaces are cleaned on a weekly basis.
- b) SAI Regional Head offices, Divisions, etc. across the country are cleaned regularly. Sensitization and Sanitization facilities including toilets, solid and liquid waste management systems, department cleanliness and safe & adequate drinking water supply are provided across all SAI facilities. Separate dustbins for biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste have been installed across the campuses.
- c) The Lakshmbai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIPE) premise along with sports infrastructure and residential blocks were cleaned under Swachhta Abhiyan. A cleaning Campaign is organized every month.

6. Status of Rationalization of Autonomous Bodies:

Does not arise in the case of D/o Sports as all the five Autonomous Bodies- SAI, LNIPE, National Sports University (NSU), NADA and NDTL have been set up for specific purposes.

7. Information on specific steps taken for utilization of the Space Technology-based tools and applications in Governance and Development:

The project on geo-tagging of sporting infrastructure across the country is under consideration. The technology to be used for geo-tagging of playfields is yet to be finalized in which space technology could be effectively utilized.
