

Name of the Ministry / Department: Department of Sports

1. Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

- a) Indian athletes had a spectacular run last month with a Podium finish in various international competitions. The Indian contingent won 22 Medals in the ITTF Fa20 Al-Watani Para Table Tennis Championships held in Amman, Jordan, won the 3rd place overall in the Asian Under-20 Athletics Championships with 19 Medals, and the shooters topped the medal tally in the ISSF Shooting Junior World Cup with 15 Medals. In addition to the above, the Junior Women's Hockey Team won its 1st ever Asia Cup, the Women Wrestling Team won the Under-23 Asian Championships team title, the men's team retained the Asian Kabaddi Championship, and Bhavani Devi bagged India's 1st ever medal at the Senior Asian Fencing Championship.
- b) At the Special Olympics World Summer Games 2023, Berlin, held between 17th and 25th June, 2023, the 280-member strong Indian contingent finished their campaign with 202 medals, including 76 Gold, 75 Silver and 51 Bronze.
- c) This Ministry has been supporting athletes in every possible way to prepare for the upcoming major competition season including the Asian Games, Hangzhou, China 2022. The ceiling amount for boarding and lodging of athletes in international competitions to provide high-quality accommodation for the athletes has recently been raised in keeping with the current norm. The athletes traveling abroad for approved competitions will now be entitled to USD 250 per day from the previous entitlement of USD 150 per day. In addition to that, the athletes are being supported holistically to ensure that they have access to state-of-the-art infrastructure, equipment, best-in-class training and support staff. This includes the approval of international exposure programs of Indian Wrestlers Vinesh Phogat (Kyrgyzstan) and Bajrang Punia (Hungary) with other several TOPS athletes travelling to countries like Nigeria, USA etc. to facilities of choice of training.
- d) Significant strides have also been made to onboard various stakeholders including the public sector enterprises for the development of sports in the country. Recently, the Badminton Junior National Training Camp at Panchkula, Haryana, and athlete identification camps at the SAI Patiala, Trivandrum, and other centres across the country were organized with support from M/s REC Ltd.
- e) The Indian Delegation led by Secretary (Sports) participated in the Seventh International Conference of Ministers and Senior Officials responsible for Physical Education and Sports (MINEPS VII) organized by UNESCO in Baku, Azerbaijan. India's participation was significant, with a special Yoga session organized for the delegates. India delivered a national statement and a national pledge affirming the nation's stance in promoting sports and fitness for the people to lead a healthy and happy life.
- f) The State/UT rounds of Fit India Quiz successfully concluded on 23rd June, 2023. The final rounds are expected to take place in July, 2023, wherein champions from 36 States/UTs will be participating.

- g) National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) organized a total of 28 Anti-Doping Education Awareness programmes across the country.
- h) The 99th, 100th, 101st and 102nd Meetings of Mission Olympics Cell (MOC) were held on 01.06.2023, 08.06.2023, 15.06.2023 and 22.06.2023 on various components of TOPS. Proposals from various athletes belonging to 09 sporting disciplines worth Rs. 2,10,01,242/- were approved.

- b) Under Swachhta Campaign, the office premises of the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) were cleaned with the active participation of the staff of NADA.
- c) The Lakshmi Bai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIFE) premises along with sports infrastructure and residential blocks were cleaned under the Swachhta Abhiyan..
